# Recap of June 12, 2016 Annual TBI Congregational Meeting

While we did not quite have a quorum at this year's meeting, those in attendance were not shy about voicing their opinions, participating in discussions and asking questions of the board. Topics covered included: a budget proposal for the next fiscal year, an update on TBI's website, accomplishments over the last 12 months, and challenges for the future.

The biggest goal achieved was, of course, the hiring of a new Rabbi, who begins her year with us this month. Rabbi Alana Wasserman from South Carolina is just as excited to serve our congregation as we are to have her. In addition, Board members identified three other goals to realize this year: define and explain roles and responsibilities of TBI officers, board members, spiritual leader, committee chairs, etc; define a mission statement for TBI; and increase one to one communication with TBI members and the community.

Board Trustee Lori Zipes completed a written document defining the responsibilities of various roles within the

shul. That document is available in the Temple office for anyone to review. The remaining two goals are in process and progress is being made.

Challenges for our Temple were also discussed, namely the need to grow our membership and to create fundraising opportunities and events to help our shul meet its financial obligations. Any ideas are welcome. And each of you is welcome to join a committee (or two) in order to help. In addition to covering the shul's business during the meeting, awards were presented to the Volunteers of the Year, Nate Mewhinney and Harold Prows, and a thank you gift was presented to the outgoing Education Director, Cynthia Gingold. Because a quorum was not present, votes by proxy will need to be made to approve the proposed budget for fiscal year 2016-17, the slate of officers, and the proposed changes to our By-Laws. Please respond promptly when you receive your proxy in the mail.

#### Harold Prows and Nate Mewhinney recognized as TBI Volunteers of the Year

With gratitude the Board of Temple B'nai Israel presented the Volunteer of the Year award to two deserving individuals: Harold Prows and Nate Mewhinney. Each received the award for their dedicated work at the Calhoun Correctional Institution in Blountstown, FL. They lead Shabbat services for the Jewish inmates on Friday evenings and on two Tuesdays a month they visit with the inmates on a more casual basis.

This mitzvah began nearly three years ago when Harold learned that no one was filling this need for Jewish prisoners. Nate joined him a short time later. TBI helped by providing some *siddurim* that are no longer used by the congregation. But because the prison rules are so strict about bringing anything into the facility, *kippot*, the small portable ark in TBI's storeroom and other ritual objects could not be donated. Still,

Harold and Nate persisted in their efforts to serve the spiritual needs of these folks. One of the prisoners confessed to Nate that these visits make him "feel human," as visits from these two traveling leaders is often the only contact with the outside world for many of them.

So, thank you Nate and Harold. You are performing a true mitzvah and we thank you!
