Meet TBI's New Rabbi, Alana Wasserman

We are very excited to welcome Rabbi Wasserman!

Many of you enjoyed our recent "Scholar in Residence" weekend led by Rabbi Alana Wasserman. We are delighted to announce that she has agreed to be Temple B'nai Israel's new Rabbi for the coming year. Rabbi Wasserman is originally from from Greenville, SC, where her husband, also a rabbi and two children, Peri and Dara, reside.

Rabbi Wasserman hails from New Jersey but spent many years in Texas while growing up. She was ordained at Hebrew Union College in New York in 2004 and returned to NJ to

lead a congregation there. She met her husband, Rabbi Jeremy Master, while in Israel as part of their rabbinic education. In 2009, they moved to Greenville when Rabbi Master accepted the pulpit at Temple Shalom Israel.



She will make the trip from Greenville approximately once per month to spend a very full weekend with us, leading services and havdalah on the Beach, working with our religious school students, visiting our members who are ill or unable to leave home, teaching us and leading us in song and prayer. She will again lead our High Holiday services as we welcome the new year and are inscribed in the Book of Life for another year.

Shavuot, Hebrew for "weeks," marks the end of counting the Omer from Passover (49 days or 7 full weeks). This is when Moses descended Mt. Sinai with the Torah for all of the Israelites. It was also a time in ancient Israel when Jews made fruit and grain offerings to commemorate the end of one

growing season and the beginning of another.

Today, Jews celebrate this occasion in several ways. One of those is to engage in the study of Torah all day and night during *Shavuot*. Studying the Torah is a mitzvah and a commandment for Jews the world over. It is said that reading the Torah is like having "milk and honey."

Another tradition while celebrating this holiday is to only eat dairy products. It's customary to eat cheesecake, blintzes, noodle kugel and similar foods, along with fresh fruits of the season. Why do we only eat dairy on *Shavuot*? Good question! You can find the answer by joining us at shul on Friday, June 10th for a great Jewish dairy *Shabbat* dinner at 6:00 pm followed by a *Shabbat* and *Shavuot* service led by Mary Starkman.
