TBI Offers Opportunities for You

In an effort to bring Jewish education and teaching opportunities to members of our congregation, the TBI Board is offering to subsidize the cost of two very meaningful and useful conferences:

ISJL Education Conference in Jackson, MS happens on June 25 – 27, 2017. TBI is affiliated with the Institute for Southern Jewish Life (ISJL) who supplies our Sunday Shul teachers with Jewish curriculum suitable for our children. The conference introduces attendees to a variety of areas including Jewish culture, history, holidays, Israel, Hebrew, ritual, prayer and much more. In addition, attendees meet and get to know this year's ISJL Fellows who will be working with us throughout the year. The cost for one TBI person to attend the conference hotel fees and mileage will be paid by TBI. If interested please call or email Daniel Sternlicht or Sarah Farkas.

URJ, the Union for Reform Judaism, with whom TBI is also affiliated, offers members from small congregations without a full-time rabbi, the opportunity to learn about leading lay services and officiating at some other Jewish rites. The program is called *Had'rachah* (meaning "guide") and is offered through OSRUI. This year Had'rachah education will take place from August 2 – 6, at the Jewish camp in Oconomowoc, WI. This is a beautiful woodsy setting in rural Wisconsin. Registration is open until June 23. TBI will pay the tuition and travel costs for one of our members to attend.
