Shalom – one word, many definitions. It means "hello," "goodbye," and "peace." The root of shalom is shalem, which means "complete, whole." At the end of the month of June, my time as Rabbi of Temple B'nai Israel will be shalem, complete. Therefore, I would like to take this opportunity to say shalom to the congregation.

As many of you know, I have wanted

to be a rabbi since I was a child. In May of 2004 my dream became a reality. In 2008, another dream came to fruition: I became a parent. I decided to be a stay-at-home mother for a while. In 2013, I was blessed with another child. And while I loved staying at home with my daughters, I missed being a rabbi. Then, this lovely opportunity presented itself. I could work as a rabbi, and still be there for my daughters almost full-time.

I have been blessed to work in a synagogue that truly understands the meaning of community. For every Shabbat and holiday, we do not merely gather together to pray; we join together to observe and celebrate. Temple B'nai Israel is a loving, nurturing, supportive congregation. As Rabbi Alexander Schindler of blessed memory once said, "The synagogue is the regenerative soil of Jewish life. Just beneath its statuesque surface, our roots densely intertwine. And while I will no longer be serving in the capacity of rabbi, I do hope all of you will stay in touch, and keep me informed. Thank you for giving me this wonderful opportunity, and making me a part of your community. Thank you for being a part of my spiritual family. I wish all of you Shalom!
