This year is an exciting one on the Jewish calendar, it's a leap year! Not only do we gain an extra day, but we gain an entire extra month. This extra month helps the Jewish calendar, which follows the lunar cycle, stay on track with the solar

calendar. It is the reason you may have already heard your friends grumbling about how late Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur fall this year.

The additional month is a second Adar. On a leap year, we have two months of Adar, Adar one and Adar two. Because Purim is typically celebrated in the month of Adar, we are left in a tricky situation: when should we celebrate Purim if the month of Adar happens twice? Well, the rabbis figured out a solution. They added in a minor festival day called Purim Katan (minor Purim) that is celebrated in the first month of Adar on the same date (the 14th of Adar) that Purim is traditionally celebrated. Both Adar and Purim are joyous celebrations as the Jews commemorate Esther and Mordecai's triumphant acts that saved our people from execution. On a leap year, we are granted the opportunity to have an extra month of joy.

So, now you know what Jewish tradition would do with an extra month: Celebrate! But it is an interesting question to consider. What would you do if you had an extra month? or even an extra day? How would you spend it?

May your leap year be filled with joy and chag Purim Sameach!
