History Lessons by Rabbi Alana Wasserman

The month of March begins and ends with Jewish holidays this year. On March 1, Jewish people around the world will be shaking their graggers at the mention of Haman's (boo!) name as we celebrate the

holiday of Purim. On March 30 and 31, we will retell the story of the Exodus through the Passover seder. Both of these holidays are based on two stories of how the Jewish people overcame persecution.

We retell these stories year after year to remind ourselves of what it was like to be enslaved and oppressed, and how precious our freedom is. We remember how much we would have appreciated help from others. We recount and recall so that history won't repeat itself.

Unfortunately, nowadays, we are experiencing an increase in prejudice. Most recently, Nikolas Cruz murdered 17 people at a Florida high school. Five of those killed were Jewish. Cruz was known for his hatred of Jewish and black people. He participated in a paramilitary training with a white supremacist group called the Republic of Florida. While

not all of the victims were black or Jewish, hatred and prejudice clearly played a role in this murder.

Retelling the story of Purim and Passover are great first steps in combatting prejudice. However, there are many more steps we need to take to prevent hatred and bloodshed. I encourage all of us to do something. Whether it's marching for stricter gun laws with the students of Marjorie Stoneman Douglas High School (March For Our Lives), or protesting speakers like Richard Spencer, do something. Our words are not enough. We need to be like Esther, Mordechai, and Moses. They spoke up and took action to end prejudice. We need to do the same.

Please do not forget to RSVP to our congregational seder. It will take place on Saturday, March 31st at 6:00 pm at Temple B'nai Israel. I hope to see you there!

The next Sisterhood meeting will be March 21st at 6:30 pm.



Temple member Norm Gulkis, 85, passed away January 25, 2018.

Norm was born January 15, 1933 in Brooklyn, NY and served in the United States Air Force during the Vietnam era. He was passionate about cooking, reading, scuba diving, his family and the community. He was Chairman of AMIKids - Panama City Marine Institute, President of Crime Stoppers and an active member of Rotary International. He was remembered at the Temple during our Shabbat service January 26; a celebration of his life was held January 29 at Messiah Lutheran Church.
