Election of officers and trustees (including voting on our new budget) will be held at our Annual Congregational Meeting on June 2nd.

Yes – There is a Church at Temple B'nai Israel by Robert Goetz

By now we are all well aware of the devastation brought on by Hurricane Michael. Property and infrastructure damage was extensive, and our homes, workplaces, and houses of prayer have been significantly altered, in some cases, even totally destroyed. Temple B'nai Israel was fortunate to have incurred only minor damage to its facility, while many churches had massive property damage.

Unity Spiritual Center (Unity) previously located on Lisenby Avenue, was one of those to incur extensive

damage. The TBI board entered into a 1-year lease agreement with Unity allowing them limited use of our facility on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Sundays

Here are some points to consider:

- Our building is an underutilized resource at a time where physical resources are diminished.
- Unity is in close proximity to TBI and has an established ongoing relationship.
- We have only been marginally successful at fund raising in recent years and have recently lost several congregants who have relocated. Rental income leverages our building assets while placing minimum burden upon congregants
- Unity members have formed a volunteer committee to help with landscaping.

The Seder Downtown by Sarah Farkas

Many TBI members and guests enjoyed a Passover Seder catered for the first time by Trigo in Downtown Panama City. Trigo has an "event space" called "131" located at 131 Harrison Avenue. Under the direction of Sisterhood president Tammy Marinuzzi, Sisterhood members Gayle Paynter, Linette Sternlicht, and Judith Scott planned, organized, ordered, arranged pick-ups and drop-offs, et cetera to get Seder 2019 off and running!

In addition, TBI friends and noted bakers/cooks – Lois Oswald, Alvin

Gingold, Linette, Joan Prows and more – treated us to home-made matzo balls, chopped liver, home-made macaroons, delicious apple cake and the very essence of Pesach: Charoses!

About 50 folks attended the second-day of Passover Seder following along in the Haggadah with TBI President Mike Starkman. Portions of the Exodus Story were read aloud by various participants, Elijah was welcomed inside along with Miriam, 4 cups of wine were consumed and a lovely meal was served.

This was a first for us – teaching Trigo management and employees about Passover and the various special foods, rituals and meaning of symbolic items like matzo, shank bone, bitter herbs, etc. The Trigo crew proved to be very teachable and did a fine job with only a couple of small issues-like only one matzo ball per bowl (that won't happen again! We were very pleased with their service and will most likely give them another chance to please us next year when we hope more of you will celebrate with us.
